

What Did You Say?

I was viewing a museum display a while back and there under the glass case was a letter penned by Abraham Lincoln, I was struck with his words that went something like Please excuse the length of this letter I didn't have time to compose a shorter note. Mr. Lincoln was very considerate of those around him and always wanted to make sure people understood what he had to say and didn't want to waste time or words. He took the time to choose his words carefully. Back in my grammar school days we had to memorize his most famous 271 word speech, The Gettysburg Address. When the time came to deliver his address some in the audience weren't fully seated and ready to listen and they missed most of his historical 2 minute message. Mr. Lincoln spent many hours in preparation before mounting the platform and delivering his speech, and was still misunderstood by some. Imagine if we spent that much time preparing our words to get our message across. Consider that nautical philosopher Popeye the Sailor who said "I ain'ts no physicist but I knows what matters". It

matters how we say what we say as no one wants to be misunderstood, or have something attributed to them that is not true. We may say we don't care what people think about us but we don't want to be wrongly quoted.

The other side of the coin is how hard do we listen to make sure we hear correctly? With our busy lives we tend to listen for sound bites and summaries and we tend to prejudge things because it is easier and saves a lot of time in making a decision. We watch a news program and pick sides, as to who is wrong (guilty) and who had an injustice heaped upon their head (innocent). Most news reporters try not to be biased but sometimes they are and we tend to agree with their storyline.

If we can show understanding when we gauge people we scarcely know how should we iudge our fellow HOG members? As fellow HOG members we already have passed two lifestyle gates; 1. We own Harley motorcycles and 2. We paid to join a riding club so we can ride with other Harley riders. For rough and tough riders we sometimes have thin skins. 
