#### **CONTROLLING YOUR LANE**


Lane position should be chosen based, among other things, on establishing escape routes, making yourself visible to others, staying out of the blind spots of other vehicles, and road conditions. What is often overlooked, in my opinion, is the concept of 'controlling your lane'.

For example, assume you are riding on surface streets in a city and are stopped at a traffic light preparing to make a right turn. Logic suggests that you should be in the right track of your lane, but it is safer, I suggest, being closer to the left track.

Why? Because while nearer the left track of your lane you CONTROL the lane. There are people that upon seeing you in the right track with your right turn signal flashing will slide their vehicles into the lane beside you and try to share the lane - to get a jump off the line when the light changes.

That you only have two wheels is of no consequence - you OWN the whole lane that they would try to share with you. If you were to change your mind and elect to not make that right turn, you would be in trouble. Worse, should that sharing vehicle actually decide to make a right turn too, you could easily be forgotten (in his blind spot) and he could drive right over you while making that turn.

Controlling your lane is as important as any other consideration when you choose your lane position.



## My View from Behind the Handle Bars

While thinking about the DJ at our Valentine party, I came up with this trivia question. What do vinyl records and PVC pipes have in common? The vinyl in vinyl records and the "V" in PVC, polyvinyl chloride, is the same thing. In chemistry, "vinyl" indicates the position of an atom in a molecule. With polyvinyl chloride, the "vinyl chloride" part means that a chlorine atom is attached to carbon atom that is double bonded to another carbon atom. The prefix "poly" means that many individual vinyl molecules called monomers were polymerized by a chemical reaction. These polymerized monomers are known as polymers and they fall into two groups; elastic and plastic. Elastic polymers change their shape when stress is applied and return to their original shape when the stress is removed (for example, rubber). Plastic polymers when stressed either do not deform, or if they do deform, they retain the new deformed shape when the stress is removed. Consumer demand for PVC, a rigid plastic polymer, was triggered by the introduction of vinyl records. Today PVC is used in doors, windows, outdoor furniture, fences, credit cards, pipes and more. PVC has a useful lifespan of over 100 years. PVC plastic can be made less rigid by adding plasticizers, and flexible PVC is used to make imitation leather (Naugahyde), inflatable boats, toys and more.

In the early days of recorded sound, phonograph records were made with shellac, a brittle material that did not stand up to everyday wear and tear. In 1931, RCA Victor replaced their shellac disc with durable PVC and the vinyl record industry was born. In the 1990s, large vinyl LP records fell out of mainstream use with the invention of CDs. But now many musical groups are going back to vinyl LP albums because vinyl has better musical purity and higher fidelity than digital CDs. We've come full circle with sound recordings. Speaking of circles...with vinyl recordings the playback groove starts at the outer edge of the circle and ends near the center. With CDs, the playback starts at the center and ends at the outer edge.

My interest in all this started with the 1937 song "They All Laughed" by George & Ira Gershwin. A line in the song goes "They all laughed when Edison recorded sound". I can't imagine a world without recorded sound. To play pre-recorded music on the new Harley Davidson ® Boom! Box Infotainment System, we can't use vinyl LPs, 8-Tracks, cassettes or even CDs. We have to use digital files (stick or Bluetooth). Playback systems may change but favorite songs are favorite songs, no matter the format. The next time you queue up your favorite artist, thank the forefathers of high fidelity. But remember, they're only responsible for the playback, not the playlist.

The point of this trip down memory lane is that when a new technology shows up, we have no way of knowing how far and in which direction it will take us. When things change all around us, life can be a little unsettling. And when we are unsettled, we should look for things that are consistent, like the Bible. In John's Gospel, we find, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God". The Word is Jesus. In the same book, John also wrote "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life". And it is comforting to remember that, in middle of our changing world, some things like the promise of God's love never change.
