If you've been on the road and had any discussions with me during a state rally, or you've attended a rally's closing ceremony, you'll get the idea of how important it is to pre-register for a HOG Rally. It IS important and here are the top 10 reasons why:

1. The money that comes in to a rally is the money we can spend on the event

2. We have an idea of how many shirts, pins and patches to order (because we limit the number that are available on site to sell)

3. We have an idea of how much money we can spend on entertainment (usually the BIGGEST expense of a rally)

4. We have a better idea of how many chairs/tables to have set up for evening entertainment, seminars, and meals that may be included

5. We can let the local dealership know so they can be prepared with cool merchandise to sell and have their service department equipped and aware in case they are needed

6. We can publicize to local businesses how many folks may be expected in town and can possibly secure additional sponsorship dollars based on the number of heads we'll put in beds.

7. Many times, rallies will offer incentives to pre-register—a much better chance to win things like FREE vacations, merchandise, or even a motorcycle!

8. If you've ever planned a wedding for one of your children you understand the NEED for people to RSVP. Rallies are no different!

9. Our volunteers can do a better job of budgeting money for prizes/awards and activities like paying for parade permits, etc.
10. We know YOU are coming—you're family and we want you to

have the best time possible AND your fellow HOG brothers and sisters who are planning the event will appreciate it!!!

As a chapter officer, you might ask how you can assist us in promoting these events and we would appreciate the help in doing that! Here are a couple of ways to help:

1. Offer a chapter-specific incentive for your members to register! What if everyone who brings their confirmation to the chapter meetings got entered into a contest for a FREE vacation offered by YOU? It could be an economical way for you to get your members out riding and having fun! Since our job is to keep taking HOG Members on an adventure, this is a great way to take them to a city or location they've never been!


2. Recognize that the bond of the road—especially on overnight events—is a very strong bond! Advertising that the chapter is taking an "overnight" trip is a good way to engage folks and taking them to the HOG rally only strengthens the bond to other HOG Members outside the chapter and state too!

BRADEN STATION

Located in the Old General Store, C T M^oCraw Building, Braden, TN

Open Thursday, Friday, at 5:00 pm ~ 9:00 pm Saturday at 4:00 pm ~ 9:00 pm Braden Station, LLC is located in the C.T. M^cCraw building located on Highway 59, between I-40 and Highway 70 (Summer Avenue) in Braden, Tennessee. Braden Station, LLC is a restaurant featuring catfish and seafood while providing a "folksy" atmosphere.

The C.T. M^cCraw Company began operation in 1881 and was located across the road from where Braden Station is now.⁻ As the C.T. M^cCraw business grew, a cotton gin and sawmill was added. In 1908, the C.T. M^cCraw building was built and served as the community's general store, hardware store, post office and bank. The C.T. M^cCraw Company was a cotton merchant business, as well.

The first floor of the building housed the general store, the local post office and the bank while cotton grading and buying operations took place on the second floor. The bank was located in the mezzanine area of the building where the original safe is still in place. Also, the C.T. McCraw building boasts the first elevator in Fayette County which goes from the basement to the second floor.

A small brick building located behind the main building was used to produce acetylene gas used to illuminate the building in place of electricity. In addition, a cemetery that pre-dates the civil war is located on the grounds.

In 1994, the general store closed operation and auctioned its inventory. The C.T. McCraw Company is still in business today, in its original location across the street from Braden Station. The C.T. McCraw Company is no longer cotton merchants but continues operations in property management and land rental. The C.T. McCraw Company and family owns approximately 13,000 acres in Tennessee, Arkansas, Mississippi and Louisiana.

In 2002, the building was purchased by its current owners and in March of that year, renovation of the building began. The shelves and the floors are original to the building.

To dispel myths, the C.T. M^CCraw building was neither a hotel nor a train depot. The train depot was located across the tracks from the C.T. M^CCraw building. The name Braden Station was provided by a passerby that suggested the name during the building's renovation.

We invite you to enjoy our food and atmosphere and hope that your dining experience is memorable. Braden Station is a smoke free environment.
